Course Description: Students in 7th grade will study aspects of World History from pre-history to the Renaissance. Students will study the most important historical periods and civilizations this year. The main goal of this class is for students to study relationships between people, places and events that have impacted world civilizations.

Preparation for Class: Students are required to bring a writing utensil, paper, 1-inch binder, spiral notebook, completed homework and the textbook to each class unless otherwise directed.
