- Understands that we are all connected

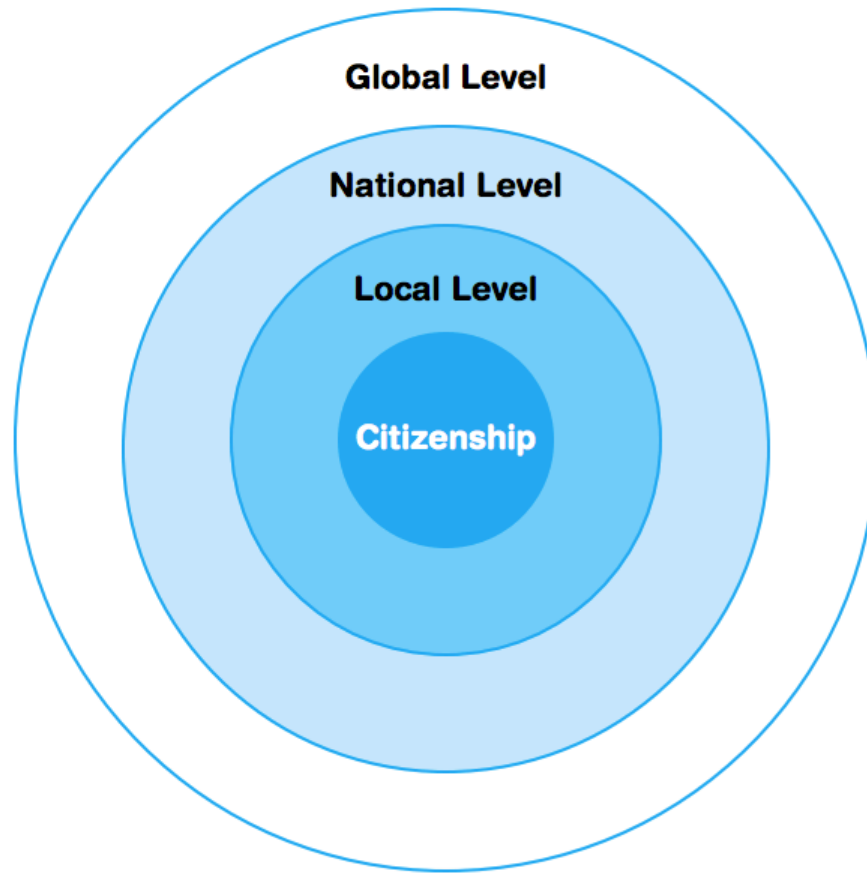


U.S. Citizen vs. Global Citizen
