


Ancient India=Indus River Valley Civilization



Today Ancient India=Pakistan

### Subcontinent

- Continent= South Asia
- Subcontinent= large landmass that is set apart from the rest of the continent
  - Known as the Indian subcontinent



## INDUS RIVER

- River begins at the *Himalaya* mountains
  - World's tallest mountains
  - Highest peak: Mount Everest
  - Indus River important to farming
  - India's first civilization grew around the Indus River: Indus Valley Civilization
- Ganges River flows in the northern part of the subcontinent (famous holy river)
  - Bath in the river to clean the body and spirit—wash away sins
  - Pilgrimages to this area





#### Harappa & Mohenjo-Daro

- Little known
- Two largest cities of Ancient India
- Mohenjo-Daro means="hill of the dead"

### The cities

- Thick walls surrounded the city
- about 40,000 people
- dozens of streets
- sturdy brick houses
- Some bathrooms/world's first sewer system
- Citadel- fort in the city
- Builders, engineers, and craft workers highly skilled

#### Highly advanced

- In mathematics
- Music instruments, toys and games, and pottery
- Uncovered—combs, soap, and medicine
- Experimented with dentistry (remains found with teeth that had been drilled)
- Cities abandoned around 1600 B.C.
  - Mystery: drought, invasion, earthquake, massive floods, standing water spread disease, forests stripped of trees, cattle overgrazed the land.





# Government & Religion

- Indus Valley people were well organized
  - Common system of weights and measurement
  - Strong central government: no royal tombs or statues
     ever found
- Scholars have found no temples or signs of priests
  - Some Indus Valley statues look like god that are worshipped in Hinduism
- Scholars haven't been able to decode their symbols (writing?)

# Aryan People

- 3 Different Theories:
  - 1500 B.C. newcomers invaded Indus Valley=Aryan people
    - Crossed Hindu Kush Mountains
    - migration: natural disasters or wars at home
  - 2. Original inhabitants
  - 3. Nomads raising cattle/horses in Afghanistan
    - Eventually migrated to Indus Valley
- Aryan means="noble ones"
  - Brought with them their language and their religion



# Caste System

- Caste= "classes"
  - decided by birth, marriage, job

- **5** groups
  - 1. Priests: emerged from Brahma's mouth
  - 2. Warriors/Ruling class: Brahma's arm
  - 3. Merchants/Artisan: Brahma's hands
    - 4. Laborers/servants: Brahma's feet
      - 5. Untouchables: seen as unclean
- Caste system is outlawed today

# Early Religion of Ancient India

- Hindu means="Indian"
- Hinduism="religion of people of India"
  - One of the world's oldest religions (5,000+ years old
  - No single founder/teacher
  - Monotheistic: believe in 1 God reincarnated into different forms
- Aryan people began writing down their sacred songs/hymns
  - known as the Vedas= means "Books of Knowledge/wisdom"

## Vedas

- Sacred holy books of their religion
  - Set of 4 books
- Written in Sanskrit
  - told Hindus how to live & explained life
  - Also introduced the *Caste System*
- Believe that prayers and hymns are revelations from the gods

# Beliefs

- Reincarnation: A cycle of birth, death, and rebirth into a new body (where you end up depends on previous life)
  - Passing through many lives to reach Brahman
  - Believe that you have live many lives and go through many experiences before you attain perfection and become one with the divine
  - The goal is to end reincarnation
- Believe in a universal spirit=Brahma/Brahman
  - created and is present in everything
- Worship many gods/goddesses, but are monotheistic
  - Worship at home, shrines, or temples (worship is called puja)
  - Brahmins=Hindu priests





Hindu's believe at the time of death:

Soul departs from body

through a Chakra

(spiritual channel in the body)

- Karma determines where soul will go


  NO hell

# Dharma

- Means "duty"
- The divine law (natural universal laws)
  - The path of righteousness by living certain codes of conduct
  - If you live out these laws it will lead to happiness
  - Requires people to perform the duties of their caste
- Good Dharma=Good Karma










- About 80% of Indian Population are Hindu
- About 800 millions Hindu's in the world
- Famous Hindu: Gandhi (1869-1948)







A third of the world's poorest people live in India

- The following are deemed poor:
  - A rural family of 5 spending less that 4,860 rupees (\$80/month)
  - An urban family spending less than 7,035 rupees (\$110/month)
  - 363 million Indians meet one of these
- 44% of children under 5 years old are malnourished
- 50% don't have proper shelter
- 70% don't have access to decent toilets
- 35% of households don't have a nearby water source
- 85% of villages don't have a secondary school
- Health care and clean drinking water is a great issue
- Life expectancy is 64 years old vs 78.7 years in the United States
