

# Primary & Secondary Sources



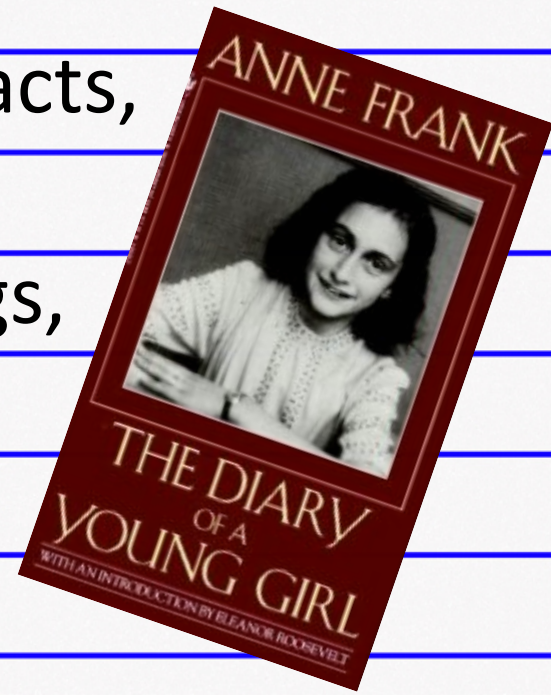


# Primary Sources



- Information that comes directly from a person who experienced an event.

- **Examples:** Letters, diaries, autobiography, speeches, artifacts, photographs, music, art, TV recordings, sculptures, paintings, newspaper articles



# Secondary Sources

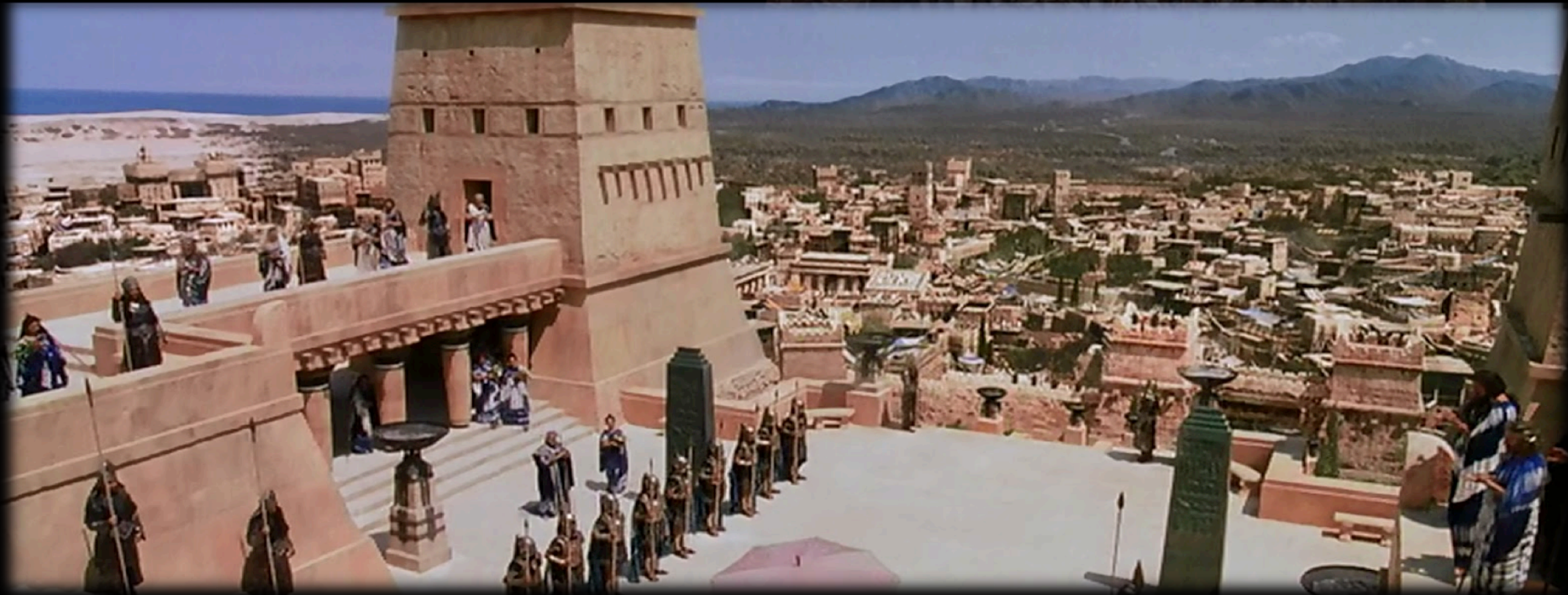
- Accounts of the past written after the event has happened.
- **Examples:** Textbook, Encyclopedia, Dictionary, Documentary, Interpretations of an event or a person.

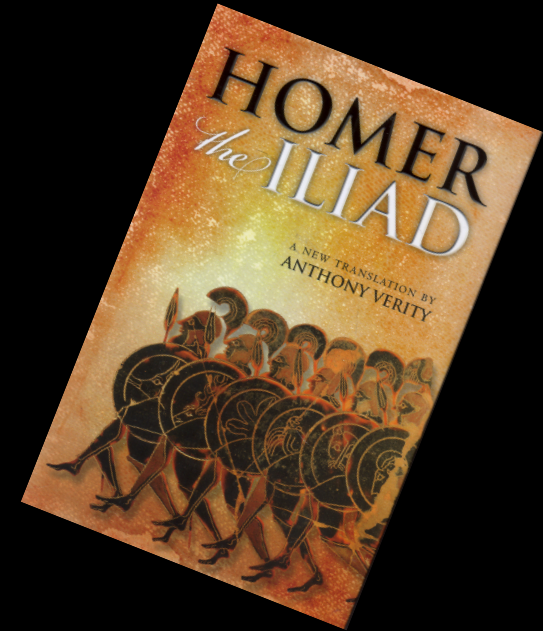

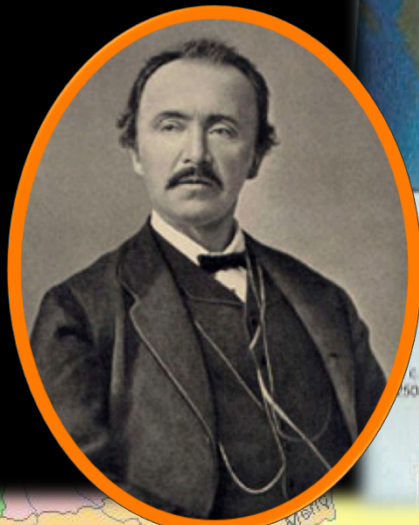


# A Thrilling Discovery

  - Walled city, guarded by heroic warriors.
- Discovered by Heinrich Schliemann in 1870
- Schliemann used primary and secondary sources to locate!
