Examples: Textbook, Encyclopedia,


Dictionary, Documentary,

A Thrilling Discovery

- A city based on legend
 - Not thought to be a real city
 - Walled city, guarded by heroic warriors.
- Discovered by Heinrich Schliemann in 1870
- Schliemann used primary and secondary sources to locate!
 - The Iliad by Homer
